**MINUTES
STREET COMMITTEE MEETING
CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA
TUESDAY, JUNE 23, 2026 AT 5:30 PM**

The Street Committee of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma met in regular session on the above date and time in the Council Chamber upstairs at City Hall, 12 North Rowe Street in Pryor Creek, Oklahoma. Notice of these meetings was posted on the East bulletin board located outside to the South of the entrance doors and the City website at www.pryorcreek.org.

1. Call meeting to order.

Terry Lamar called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Members present: Terry Lamar, Bruce Smith and Kenneth Brashears. Members absent: none.

Others present: Mayor Zac Doyle, Buddy Glenn, Autumn Graybill and Gilbert Graybill.

a. Petitions from the audience.

There were no petitions from the audience.

b. Discussion and possible action to approve the minutes of the March 24, 2026 meeting.

Motion was made by Brashears, second by Smith to approve the minutes of the March 24, 2026 meeting. Voting yes: Lamar, Smith and Brashears. Voting no: none. *Motion passed.*

c. Discussion and possible action regarding nomination of the Street Committee Chairperson.

2. Reports:

a. Street Superintendent Report - Buddy Glenn.

Glenn reported that he has been working to correct several drainage issues throughout the city. He stated that they also worked downtown to prepare Graham for Fourth of July decorations, and he plans to begin painting crosswalks and stop bars when the rain dries.

b. Discussion regarding Capital Outlay equipment purchases expected in the 2026-2027 fiscal year.

Glenn reported that he intends to replace the department's skid steer in the coming fiscal year. He stated that the equipment's age has created difficulty making repairs and obtaining parts. He also reported that they may seek out a backhoe and bucket truck in the coming years to improve operations.

Lamar moved to item 3b.

b. Discussion and possible action regarding the Street Department pay plan.

Motion was made by Smith, second by Brashears to approve drafting new job descriptions for Street Department operators. Voting yes: Smith, Brashears and Lamar. Voting no: none. *Motion passed.*

Lamar moved back to item 2c.

c. Discussion regarding remaining improvement projects for the 2025-2026 fiscal year.

Glenn reported that they are continuing to evaluate solutions for the repair of Dog Pound Road. He also reported that the NE 1st Street sidewalks will likely be grouped in with the Bailey Street drainage project due to some overlapping landscape requirements. Mayor Doyle reported that the Brookfield Terrace drainage project has been broken into two phases, the first from Centennial Park to the culverts in Brookfield Terrace and the second from those culverts to the Ridgewood cul-de-sac. He also reported that the engineer is working to obtain an easement from a property owner to continue the Bailey Street drainage project.

3. Action Items:

Motion was made by Smith, second by Brashears to recommend Council action to review the intersection of South Elliott and 29th Street. Voting yes: Brashears, Lamar and Smith. Voting no: none. *Motion passed.*
