

**MINUTES
CITY COUNCIL MEETING
FOLLOWED BY PRYOR PUBLIC WORKS AUTHORITY MEETING
CITY OF PRYOR CREEK, OKLAHOMA
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5TH, 2024 AT 6:00 P.M.**

The City Council of the City of Pryor Creek, Oklahoma met in regular session on the above date and time in the Council Chamber upstairs at City Hall, 12 North Rowe Street in Pryor Creek, Oklahoma. This meeting was followed immediately by a meeting of the Pryor Public Works Authority. Notice of these meetings was posted on the East bulletin board located outside to the South of the entrance doors and the City website at www.pryorcreek.org. Notice was also emailed to The Paper newspaper and emailed to the Council members.

1. CALL TO ORDER, PRAYER, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, ROLL CALL.

Mayor Doyle called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The Prayer and Pledge of Allegiance were led by Lori Bradshaw. Roll Call was conducted by City Clerk Courtney Davis. Council members present included Terry Lamar, Choya Shropshire, Lori Bradshaw, Kenneth Brashears, Tyler Brown, Charles Tramel, Chris Gonthier and Bruce Smith. Members absent: none.

Department Heads and other City Officials present: Chase McBride, Jeremy Cantrell, Justin Couch, Kevin Tramel, Becki Sams-Benham, BK Young, Frank Powell, Buddy Glenn, Dennis Bowman, Johnny Janzen, Cari Rerat and Mike Moore.

2. PETITIONS FROM THE AUDIENCE:

3. APPROVE MAYOR TO SIGN A PROCLAMATION DECLARING NOVEMBER 5TH, 2024 JOHN HAWKINS DAY.

4. DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS.

a. Building Inspector

Mayor Doyle reported on behalf of Kenny Young that the department has completed 36 paid inspections, 2 additional inspections and several plan reviews.

b. Emergency Management

Janzen reported that there was some confusion over the recent tornado warnings and explained that the warnings issued by the National Weather Service only covered half of the city, causing the confusion. He stated that the National Weather Service sets warnings and notifies the affected residents by phone call while Mayes County Emergency Management will only send alerts through CodeRED.

c. Fire

Young reported that they have successfully made it through the burn ban and drought, and the department is thankful for the rain.

d. Golf

Bowman reported that October's beautiful weather helped the Golf Course serve a record number of players for this time of year. He stated that they have been very busy with tournaments with 122 kids attending the Inola Longhorns Tournament. Bowman also reported that the Employee Appreciation Tournament has been postponed until November 16th, 2024 while they recover from the latest storm.

e. Library

Rerat emailed Council a report of the Library's statistics for October showing a decrease in usage due to their shorter hours. Rerat thanked Terry Lamar for his work on the "CemeTerry" Tour and stated that she's received great feedback on the event. She also reported that they are holding story times at 11:30 and 1:30 on Wednesdays and they will host an adult Movie Night on Thursday showing "Planes, Trains and Automobiles."

f. Parks / Cemetery

Powell reported that the parks have seen a lot of events and parties this fall and they have begun their fall and winter maintenance routines. He also stated that they’ve been seeing a lot of vandalism at the park bathrooms and are working to clean it up quickly. Powell also reported that the cemetery is running well.

g. Police / Animal Shelter

Cantrell reported that the Police Department had a busy month in October with Halloween, but saw few incidents. He stated that there was one stolen vehicle incident that has been handled and they have found a suspect in a break in at the liquor store.

Sams-Benham reported that the Animal Shelter took in 24 animals and had 23 outgoing animals in October, leaving them with a total of 45 animals currently in the shelter. She stated that they are planning a Veteran’s Day adoption event for this weekend. She also reported that both the employees and dogs are struggling with the rain limiting use of the outdoor pens.

h. Recreation Center

Moore reported that the Recreation Center HVAC has been installed and is working well. He also stated that they are working on a plan to paint the restrooms near the pool area. Moore reported that there were 98 new memberships in October, bringing total memberships to 1,755 which is down slightly from the previous month. He also stated that they have hosted 14 public pool parties, 3 private pool parties and 36 swim lessons. He also reported that their “Fitter Faster” Challenge saw 10 participants. Moore stated that they have been working on their social media presence with their “Staff Fridays” series as well as improving staff safety by installing panic buttons and conducting active shooter training.

i. Street

Glenn reported that the department has been working on curb and base repairs, pouring fresh concrete and clearing drainage. He stated that they did have a downed tree on Southeast 2nd and Hogan and thanked the Fire Department and Emergency Management for their help. He also reported that their new truck will be arriving mid December and they are beginning fall street sweeping soon.

j. City Clerk

Davis reported that her office has been working through staffing shortages, but a new temporary employee for court started this week. She stated they have filed 57 court cases, issued 132 warrants, taken 472 payments, entered 473 purchase orders, issued 37 permits and closed 23 permits. She also stated that August’s financials are finished and the new credit card processing is now live and available on the website.

RE: Recommended Residential Electric Rate Adjustment

Dear Mayor and Council:

At the Municipal Utility Board's last regularly scheduled meeting on November 18, 2024, one of the agenda items for discussion was a proposed residential electric rate increase inside the corporate city limits.

Our purchased electric rate from the Grand River Dam Authority has increased on average 4% since October 1, 2024. This increase was determined by GRDA's Cost of Service Study that was recently performed by their consultant.

This new rate structure was approved at GRDA's April 2024 Board of Director's Meeting.

I am requesting that the residential electric rate inside the corporate city limits increase from \$0.0772 per kWh to \$0.0790 per kWh. If this increase is approved by council, the average residential electric customer (1,000 kWh) inside corporate city limits will see an increase on average of \$1.90 on their monthly electric bill.

The recommendation above will allow us to maintain a robust electric distribution system, provide us the means to expand the existing electric distribution where needed and maintain the same customer service the citizens of Pryor Creek are used to receiving for years to come.
